What are cookies?

A cookie is a very small file that is downloaded to the user's computer/smartphone/tablet when accessing certain web pages to store and retrieve information about the navigation that takes place from that computer. To learn more about cookies, I invite you to access the following link:

What are cookies used for?

The sole purpose of using cookies is to remember the user's preferences (language, country, login, browser characteristics, information on the use of our website, etc.)

By remembering your preferences we will know the characteristics of the computer you are using and thus be able to offer you a better browsing experience. Cookies can help our Web site distinguish the user's browser as a previous visitor and thus save and remember preferences that may have been set while the user was browsing the site, customize home pages, identify which parts of a site have been visited, or keep a record of selections in a "shopping cart.

They can also be used to obtain information about the traffic within the site itself and to estimate the number of visits made.

Cookies are normally used by websites to obtain statistical information about their web pages. Please note that we collect data about your movements and use of our website as statistical data, not personal data.

Types and purposes of cookies

Below is a list of the cookies you can find on our website and a brief description of their purpose. We assure you that none of them retain any personally identifiable information about you. Some cookies personalise your visit, others remember your preferences, while still others only provide us with visitor statistics.

Protection safeguards

The user can configure his or her browser to accept or not the cookies he or she receives, or for the browser to warn him or her when a server wants to save a cookie or delete it from his or her computer. You can find instructions in the security configuration of your web browser.

Examples:

- If you use Microsoft Internet Explorer, under the menu option Tools > Internet Options > Privacy > Settings.
- If you use Firefox, under the menu option Tools > Options > Privacy > Cookies.
- If you use Google Chrome, from the Settings > Privacy menu
- If you use Safari, under the menu option Preferences > Security

You can use the "Help" section on the toolbar of most browsers to change the settings on your computer, however, some of the features of our online services may not work or may be more difficult to access if you reject all cookies.

Many browsers allow you to activate a private mode whereby cookies are always deleted after your visit. Depending on the browser, this private mode can have different names, below you can find a list of the most common browsers and the different names of this "private mode":

- Internet Explorer 8 and above: InPrivate
- FireFox 3.5 and above: Private Browsing
- Google Chrome 10 and above: Incognito
- Safari 2 and above: Private Navigation
